Loft-inspired design makes global debut

Two more new hotels have landed at Pierre Elliott Trudeau International Airport and a third is approaching.

Starwood Hotels & Resorts Worldwide Inc. introduced its first new lifestyle brand **Aloft** Hotels with the 136-room **Aloft** Montreal Airport yesterday.

Developed and owned by the joint venture between the Silver Hotel Group and Northampton Group Inc., the hotel features a loft-inspired design.

"The sleekness and dynamism of the **Aloft** lifestyle complements the sophistication and

style of Montreal, where we are proud to make our global debut," said Brian McGuinness, Starwood's vice-president of aloft and element hotels worldwide.

On Wednesday, Marriott Hotels & Resorts of Canada also brought a new concept to town with the opening of the Fairfield Inn & Suites Montreal Airport - its 10th property in Quebec, but first Fairfield & Suites.

The \$20-million project offers 162 guest rooms and suites.

Marriott is developing the full-service Montreal Airport Marriott slated to open next year that

will connect to the airport via a walkway.

Quint Hotels, which acquired two other hotels at the Dorval airport, will own and operate the Fairfield as well.

"We wanted to add a prestige brand to our portfolio of hotels and Marriott came as our first choice," Quint president Theodore Quint said.

"Our goal is to ensure that the associates are provided with the proper support and tools to deliver exceptional guest service and create a memorable experience in our hotels for our valued customers."
